

EU-China: some facts

Global recovery remains fragile

EU-China:

- 2nd largest trade partner (after US)
- Trade balance (2008):

EU imports: €248 bn (goods)

EU exports: € 78 bn (goods)

Foreign Direct Investment (2008):

EU inward investment to China: €4.5 billion

China inward investment to EU: €0.1 billion





"Buy China"

- Discrimination against foreign companies
- Not in line with anti-protectionism rhetoric / domino effect
- Hinders timely accession to WTO GPA





Market access / investment

- Establish stable and transparent framework
- Lift restrictions on investment
- Tackle problem of forced technology transfer





Compliance with international rules

- Implement WTO commitments (transparency, NTBs, etc.)
- WTO incompatible subsidies
- NTBs and standards: Chinese Compulsory Certification





IPR protection

- Scale of production of counterfeit / pirated goods remains alarmingly high
- Multilateral approach
- Ensure strict enforcement
- Reinforce customs controls





Access to raw materials

- China 3rd largest importer
- Export taxes / export restrictions





Climate change

- Participation of all major economies
- Avoid carbon leakage
- Reform Kyoto mechanisms
- Energy efficient products
